

Over time, Haee becomes restless with the comfortable routine and decides to venture out of home.




He gets to know some cats in a back alley behind the neighbourhood.

No one hangs out with Whie because of her unusually big red nose. It covers almost her entire face. She is an outcast because she looks different from




But Haee is not bothered by Whie's big red nose.

In fact, Haee finds Whie really special and interesting.




Whie has an unusual eating habit. She refuses to kill another living being for food.






While other cats hunt for lizards, rats, roaches, and grasshoppers, Whie eats the leftover pizzas in the back alley.






She finishes the leftover pizzas in the alley, leaving nothing to the lizards, rats, and roaches.

Whie tries to save these small animals from being eaten by other cats in the back alley.




As a vegetarian, Whie believes she can save the world by making it a better and more harmonious place to live in.
